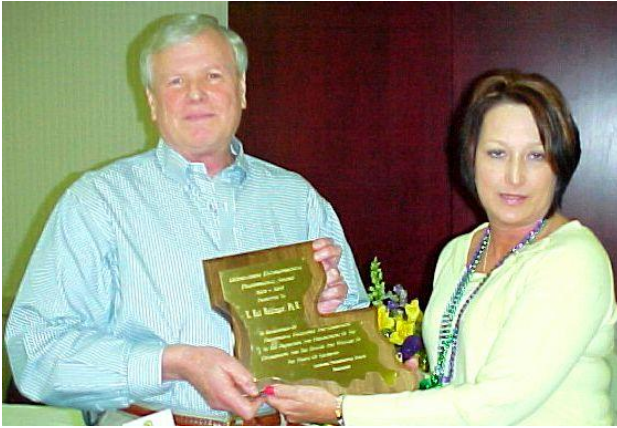


## 2005 LEHA Award Recipients



### Outstanding Environmental Professional

***L. Hall Bohlinger, Ph.D.*** – Dr. Bohlinger was Secretary of the Louisiana Department of Environmental Quality, Deputy Secretary, and Assistant Secretary under various governors.

He was instrumental in initiating the Low Level Waste (LLW) Compact, a commission created to work with the Department of Energy and the Nuclear Regulatory Commission (NRC) to determine the siting of LLW disposal sites. This enabled the cleaning up of low level Radiation waste sites around the country, and has written technical papers on the matter.

Hall was also instrumental in writing the Radiation Protection regulations for Louisiana. He was active as a liaison between the Nuclear Regulatory Commission and helped Louisiana qualify to be recognized by the Conference of Radiation Control Program Directors, Inc. (CRCPD) as an agreement state.
